INTRODUCTION TO THE FUNERAL MASS

In the Gospel written by Matthew, Jesus asks his disciples this way about John the Baptist: "What did you go out to see? A man dressed up in fancy clothes? People who dress like that live in palaces! What did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes indeed, but you saw much more than a prophet." These words become a reality today once again. Today all of us have come out to bid farewell to a prophet, a friend, and a guru. Fr. Herve Morissette was born in 1936. After joining the Congregation of Holy Cross in Canada, he came to India as a missionary almost immediately after his ordination in 1961. He was assigned to work in the Bengal Mission, and though he did his language studies he could not get the required permissions to work in Mizoram.

Eventually, he was assigned to South India as vocation promoter and formator: A responsibility he would fulfil quite diligently. A good number of the present senior Holy Cross are fruit of his youthful efforts. He would eventually go for higher studies and chose catechetics as his subject. He became a respected scholar in the field, and authored several books that soon became a hit among young seminarians and priests. It is about this time that he began to get involved in animating Teachers' Teams and Christian Life Movement. He also held responsibilities in formation, including the post of Novice Master.

Towards the second part of his priestly ministry, he entered into ministering to families. What started as a small involvement became his 'obsession' especially when it became possible to devote all his time to it. He never gave up his passion for catechetics. His background in catechetics afforded him a unique perspective on what the families were going through, and soon scores of people began to find him and his approach very endearing. This continued for as long as his health allowed him. But even after he moved to the Senior Priests' home, he continued to write. He continued to contribute until the day he was taken to the hospital a few weeks ago. His health had been slowly deteriorating during the last few months, and he was aware of it. He did not like the idea of staying on using dialysis. Fr. Herve Morissette lived a full life, without regrets.

Our superior general Bro. Paul Bednarczyk writes in his message, "Fr. Herve Morissette's numerous contributions to the life and mission of Holy Cross regarding education and formation are legendary, and his wisdom and presence will be sorely missed by many. As we commemorate our Founder's 150th anniversary of his entrance into eternity, it is a time to reflect on the poignancy of this moment as Fr. Herve now follows Father Moreau and so many other French Canadian and Indian confreres who gave their lives for the mission in India out of their love for the Lord, Holy Cross, and the Indian people. May Fr. Herve's example and the examples of so many more before him continue to inspire us in our own religious lives and ministries."

Today, people of all walks of life – Bishops, Provincials, confreres, religious sisters, and lay people – have come recognizing what this unassuming 'grandfather priest' was able to accomplish in their individual lives. We are here because he touched us in his own unique way. In this Eucharist let us express our love for this man and gratitude for the God who brought him to us.

Today's Eucharist is presided over by Most Rev. Peter Machado, the Archbishop of Bangalore. Most. Rev. Thomas Macwan, the Archbishop of Gandhinagar and the chairman of the CCBI catechetical commission and the Archbishop of Gandhinagar, bishop Raja Rao, of the diocese of Visakhapatnam, bishop Lumen Monteiro, of the Diocese of Agartala, and Bishop Stephen Rotluanga of the Diocese of Aizawl, Fr. Duming Gonsalves, Executive Secretary of CCBI Catechetical commission, Fr. Arul Raj Gali, Executive Secretary to CCBI Commission for Family, Fr. Simon Fernandis, the Provincial Superior of North East India, Fr. Joseph Gaspar, the Provincial Superior of Tamil Nadu, Fr. Roque D'costa the Provincial Superior of South India, FFr. Walter Dsa, Fr. NI Michael and Fr. Luke will be the concelebrants. Along with the Congregation of Holy Cross, let us celebrate the life lived by Fr. Herve here with us, and commit him to eternity with God.

EULOGY

People often say that when we are alive others do not say half as many good things about us as when we are dead. I believe Fr. Herve Morissette may have been a poignant exception to it. Even when he was alive most people had only good things to say about Fr. Morissette, and they did have a lot to say. It was not because Fr. Morissette did not have weaknesses, but because in most people's experience his good deeds far outweighed his limitations.

Fr. Morissette was firstly and primarily very devoted to his call to religious life in Holy Cross and priesthood. All those who have lived with him, and especially those who have been fortunate to have been his formees, can vouch for his simple spirituality. His spirituality was lived out in the simplicity of his life, the little things he needed for himself, his regularity for religious exercises, and in his sincere commitment to ministry. On one fine day, in Dahisar Mumbai he discovered that the priest who was to say Marathi Mass could not make it. Rather than canceling the Mass, he went ahead and celebrated the Mass in Marathi. It may still be talked about in Mumbai more for the effort than the outcome. Such was his passion for the ministry.

Most people who have met Fr. Morissette know him as an affectionate, unassuming, and humorous grandfather priest. He was an authority on catechetics, and authored several books on how to make Jesus of the gospels approachable to the young generations. But despite his scholarship in the Bible and catechetics, he liked to prepare his Sunday homilies well in advance. His homily usually would be ready by Wednesday or Thursday. Until Sunday he would meditate over it and even practice it. Such was his respect for those who came to listen to him.

Fr. Morissette interacted with thousands of youngsters during his seminars and workshops. His account of the life of Jesus was always peppered by everyday experiences that ordinary people could relate to. Two things stood out in the way he did catechetics: Firstly, it demonstrated the deep love he had for God and youngsters. Secondly, he made it absolutely accessible to men and women on the streets. His methodology and perspective always remained socially relevant. It was not just his teachings that reflected his love for the ordinary. Though he was born and brought up in a developed country, he truly embraced what India stood for. He desired to live as an average Indian lived. In 1995 he wrote to his superiors: "I wish to inform my superiors that, in such eventuality or at the time of retirement, I would prefer to receive medical care in India and not be repatriated to Canada for that purpose. God willing, I shall pass over "to the other shore" from that land which has always been for me a promised land."

Though catechetics was his professed area of work, he had a soft corner for the Teachers' Teams. He believed in them and valued what these Teams stood for. He would remain happily associated with them for close to four decades.

Fr. Morissette could be tough on his formees when he wanted to be. But no one was left in doubt whether he loved his formees. He introduced a variety of workshops to them, made them in-charges of distributing his books, and ever so gently pushed them to act in English plays that he would arrange for hundreds to watch. Fr. Morissette was a new phenomenon to the formees.

Fr. Morissette loved a good meal, preferably with some eggs and some bread. He had a sweet tooth. He had an extraordinary sense of humor and an infectious laughter that attracted people to him. He loved playing pranks, some quite elaborate, on his friends. Many of his formees will still remember how he fooled everyone through his hypnotism trick. In reality, he always had a trick up his sleeve.

Towards the last few years of his life, he devoted most of his time to reach out to families, and to help them to pray meaningfully. He grew close to the group of families who regularly gathered to pray together in Vivekanagar. He continued to write. He edited the small newsletter 'Family Light' for Holy Cross Family Ministries for many years. He compiled a book of prayers for families. Almost as his last contribution he had just finalized a publication commissioned by the CCBI when he became too weak to write.

Fr. Herve Morissette is no more here. But he is more than 'here'. We are here because of grief and gratitude. We grieve that he is no more with us as he used to be. And yet we are grateful that we had such a wonderful human being with us for many years. Even as we take Fr. Morissette from here and commit his body to the dust where it came from, let us not allow Fr. Morissette to leave our lives. The impression he made, the inspiration he gave and the love and affection he shared with us must live on. I am sure each of us has at least one story to tell about him. He loved stories. He sprinkled them all over in his books and homilies. Let me then conclude with an anecdote: It was one of his birthdays. Fr. Morissette was an assistant formator. The superior of the community delivered a long speech in which an exhaustive list of the positive qualities of Fr. Morissette was sufficiently highlighted. Fr. Morissette was embarrassed, to say the least. Later in his response-speech, he said to the superior, "Thank you for pointing out my qualities. But you missed an important one." As all people looked at him with disbelief, he continued with a mischievous smile, "you missed my humility!"

If he could speak now, I am sure he would have had something humorous to respond to what I spoke. He loved everyone, and was loved by everyone. May God admit him into his eternal love.

Homily at the funeral Mass of Rev. Fr. Herve Morissette, CSC

(Born: 21-03-1936 Died: 23-01-2023)

It was on January 23rd that Fr. Herve Morissette, CSC, our dear confrere, breathed his last at the age of 87. Today's celebration once more sets before us the reality of death. It renews our sorrow for the loss of those who were dear and good to us. Yet, more importantly, the liturgy increases our hope in the life after for them and for ourselves.

Indeed death brings sadness, because parting is so painful. The passing away of Fr. Morissette, makes us sad; but as our Holy Cross Constitution #118 reminds us: "We do not grieve as men without hope, for Christ the Lord has risen to die no more..." The Mass of the Resurrection which we celebrate today is a reminder that in Jesus the sadness of death gives way to the bright promise of eternity. And so as one who "has run the race and fought the good fight" and whom the Good Lord had commissioned to be an ardent missionary as a Holy Cross Priest, may the same Lord now accept Fr. Herve into heaven and into the joy that never ends!

Let me also quote Pope Francis who reminded us on All Souls Day 2017 that "the faith we profess in the resurrection makes us men and women of hope, not despair; men and women of life, not death; for we are comforted by the promise of eternal life, grounded in our union with the risen Christ. This hope, rekindled in us by the Word of God, helps us to be trusting in the face of death. Jesus has shown us that death is not the last word; rather, the merciful love of the Father transfigures us and makes us live in eternal communion with Him." Our confrere Fr. Herve Morissette, believed this, preached this, and lived this truth. And so today we rejoice that he is with God.

My association with Fr. Morissette spans over five decades, from the time I joined in Museum Road in 1969, but more closely when I was his Novice at Viveknagar in 1973, and then later on from 1982-1988. He was a community man, cheerful and affectionate. He was a deeply spiritual person, a holy priest, an obedient religious, a gentle human being, and a friend to all. One could truly say of Fr. Herve that he was a priest who gave his life fully for the gospel. He preached the word in season and out of season, when it was joyfully received or when it was cynically rejected. While in need to be ministered himself, he ministered to others; while wounded himself, he healed the wounds and comforted others. Though sometimes broken in heart and spirit, he reconciled, forgave, offered courage and hope to those alienated and estranged. This was the priest, Fr. Herve! And today we realize how fortunate we were to have him with us for all these many years! His missionary life began when he left Canada and came to India in 1962 and went to then

E. Pakistan, today Bangladesh, and has spent the rest of his priestly life in India. His profile is vast, but let me just mention about his love for India; -- he became an Indian citizen! Here is his testament which was written on August 10, 1995: "I wish to inform my superiors that, in such eventuality or at the time of retirement, I would prefer to receive medical care in India and not be repatriated to Canada for that purpose God willing, I shall pass over "to the other shore" from that land which has always been for me a promised land. I thank the community of Holy Cross for the various ministries that were entrusted to me during my life."

His life of prayer, his pastoral zeal, and his passion to be a good Holy Cross religious, are without doubt the legacy that he leaves behind; and we thank him for his exemplary life. His work in Catechetics is well known all over India. The CCBI even honored him a few years ago; and the presence of so many Archbishops, Priests, Religious and Lay people speaks for itself. THANK YOU FR. HERVE.

In his early years he sometimes played pranks on others, and when he succeeded, he laughed a lot, becoming red like a tomato! But when he was angry he would also turn red—and didn't we know that! His famous expression at that time was "you see, you see, you see Lumen"! But know this, that after such incidents he would call you to his room and apologize. That was Fr. Herve...very truly human person with a heart of gold!

While I offer my prayers for our revered Confrere, my Mentor and Friend Fr. Herve Morissette, CSC, who has departed from our midst but not from our minds, I consider this time as an occasion to be grateful and thankful to God for having put such a wonderful person in my life's path. Thank you Fr. Herve!

And we pray that God grant you eternal rest.

AN EXEMPLARY RELIGIOUS

January 23, 2023 – a sad day for the Congregation of Holy Cross, a sad day for Teachers Teams, a sad day for the youth, a sad day for the Church! Reverend Father Herve Morissette bid goodbye to the world this day!

The last words I heard him utter in St. Martha's Hospital were "take me home, take me home". Little did I know that he was talking about his Father's Home! I guess he is now Resting peacefully in the presence of his Creator.

Fr. Herve was indeed a tall figure in the Congregation and in the Church. He left his country Canada and came to live and serve in our country India! There had never been a moment of turning back on that initial commitment. Though English was not his mother tongue, he went on to master it and went on to author many books for the enrichment of the youth, family and adults. Just before he was hospitalized for the last time, he was able to complete a 3-volume catechesis for adults, commissioned by the Conference of Catholic Bishops of India. The three volume textbook "The Emmaus Experience: Catechism for Adults" was released on 28th of January, 2023, during the 34th CCBI Plenary Assembly at St. John's National Academy of Health Sciences, Bangalore. It was released by His eminence, Filipe Neri Cardinal Ferrao, President CCBI and Archbishop of Goa and Daman. He was truly a giant in the field of faith formation!

Fr. Herve wrote not just for others but for himself as well. He not only preached for others but also for himself. He practiced what he preached. He lived a simple life style and made no demands whatsoever for his comforts. As one of his many novices, I learnt a lot from. The classes that he took were reflected in his day to day life. His concern for the poor was seen as we spent time daily constructing mud houses for the homeless. He not just gave instructions but was involved himself in mixing the earth with the available dirty water. Though we were initially hesitant to do that work, yet his example pulled us into it. Truly he was a man of the Gospels – giving 100% in everything he undertook. He never tired of reaching out and doing good!

I am eternally grateful for all his contribution in my life. As a superior/leader he always dealt with others with compassion. As a subordinate, he was always willing to accept whatever was asked of him. WELL DONE, GOOD AND FAITHFUL SERVANT! NOW ENTER INTO THE JOY OF THE MASTER!

At Asian Continental and International Conferences He dealt with topics with great acumen and easy so much so he was

admired and appreciated by one and all.

I had the opportunity to attend with him an International Conference in Paris, as well as Continental Meetings in Bangladesh and Kuala Lumpur. I cannot fail to record my gratitude to him. His deep faith in God is exemplary. So also he always obeyed God's will even unto his last. He found fulfilment in his religious life. He lived 67 years of religious life and made India his much loved home.

With great joy he can utter the words of St. Paul: "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. From now on, a merited crown awaits me "2 Tim 4:7-8.

On the other side God must have joyfully welcomed him, saying, Come my good and faithful servant, enter into the joy of God's kingdom, Mt.

25:21.

As I pray for his soul, I recall his salutary words, "If you have no joy in your life, there is a leak in your faith somewhere".

There also you can get clues to face the challenge.


